At 10.00 o' clock Thomson's arms were tied and the ship's crew formed a lane. Every man had a length of knotted cord. The thief had to run between the lanes of men, every man striking him as he passed. After passing one round he fainted and dropped down.

Agron Thomas

He quarrelled with another seaman and drawing a long knife attempted to stab him. He was sentenced to receive one hundred and fifty lashes and was sent around all the ships in the fleet so they could witness his punishment.

Edward Mangin
